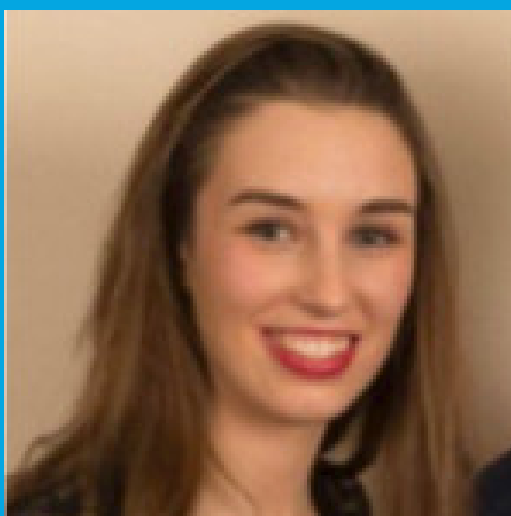
Ms. Catherine Marsh

NEW INITIATIVES



HSE Spark's call for public sector employees to approach healthcare challenges from a new perspective resulted in the launch of Spark Fusion. Teams, comprising Health Service Executive staff and at least one other public sector organisation, were invited to apply for funding ranging from €5,000 to €50,000 to support collaborative projects. The response was overwhelming, with numerous frontline HSE healthcare staff and public sector organisations demonstrating outstanding collaboration and innovation. Spark Fusion received over 40 proposals, showcasing a diverse array of solutions, from advanced technologies to initiatives promoting health equity. In recognising that health determinants extend beyond healthcare institutions, Spark Fusion aligns with the Healthy Ireland Framework 2013-25, aspiring to a future where everyone in Ireland achieves optimal physical and mental health. The initiative showcases remarkable enthusiasm for collaboration, with applications pouring in from various teams, including partnerships with An Garda Síochána, the Department of Justice, Local Authorities, and the Department of Education.



During Public Sector Transformation Week 2023, our fellows, Catherine (ONMSD) and Michelle (HSCP), introduced 'Spark Connect', a pioneering initiative designed to catalyse innovation and collaboration in healthcare settings across Ireland. Throughout the week, teams from every county across the country participated in innovation sprints that challenged them to reshape or rethink services in both inpatient and outpatient care settings. The week kicked off with a compelling online session, "Interviews with Innovators," exchanging success stories and their experiences of delivering healthcare innovation projects nationwide. Frontline staff members from the Health Service Executive shared their innovation journeys, bringing to light the real-life impact within their roles. As a commitment to empowering frontline staff, the first ever 'Spark Connect Toolkit' was distributed, unlocking innovation potential and fostering creative solutions for enhanced healthcare delivery.



DESIGN WORKSHOPS WITH MARTIN RYAN

At Spark, we're convinced that design holds the power to enhance healthcare. It goes beyond appearances; it's about creating solutions that function seamlessly and are user-friendly. Meet Martin Ryan, an exceptional designer and founder of 'Actionable'. Martin delivers our '[Design Thinking](#)' Workshops, where he shares his expertise. We focus on human-centred design, looking at how to think and work like a designer. Martin's practical tips help attendees understand what users need, build empathy, and go from a problem to a solution. In these hands-on workshops, innovators work together on problem-solving and creating solutions. These workshops give clinicians practical experience with design thinking tools, making sure participants truly understand what users need in any innovative project. HEALING SPACES

Healing Spaces is an elective project by TU Dublin School of Architecture, Building, and Environment, looking into the art of designing better spaces for medical care. In collaboration with HSE Spark Innovation, the Mater Transformation Team, and the Oncology



Day Ward and Inpatient Unit at Mater Hospital Dublin, students embarked on a journey to reimagine healthcare settings, focusing on cancer care. This initiative stands as a testament to the partnership between HSE Spark Innovation Programme, TU Dublin's School of Architecture, Building and Environment (SABE), and Mater Transformation. Together, they are shaping a unique healthcare elective module for architecture students. The ambition of the project is to inspire the architects of tomorrow to think innovatively about the environments in which healthcare is delivered. Integrating medical insights from Mater Hospital and architectural expertise from TU Dublin, the initiative envisions creating healing spaces that cater authentically to the needs of cancer patients.
