We must articulate a voice that is relevant


Relevant to person centred care AND the international health policy agenda We must work at a local, national and international level to achieve this.



# When nurses participate in health services decision making and policy development..






Emerged as a Campaign from the Triple Impact report-UK All Party Parliamentary Report on Global Health
Chaired by Lord Nigel Crisp (2016)

Launched 28<sup>th</sup> of February in London: Duchess of Cambridge, Lord Crisp (NN), Annette Kennedy (ICN), Elizabeth Iro (WHO) and Geneva: Princess Muna al Hussain Dr Tedros (WHO), Sheila Tlaou (NN) & myself (ICN)



### Findings

- Universal Health Coverage will not be achieved without developing nursing globally. Nurses are the largest part of the professional health workforce and provide an enormous amount of care and treatment worldwide; however, they are very often under-valued and under-utilised. Nurses could have an even more significant impact in the future – and will be decisive as to whether UHC is achieved.
- Developing nursing will have the triple impact of contributing to three of the Sustainable Development Goals – improving health, promoting gender equality, and strengthening economies





3 Year campaign 2018-2020 (bi centenary of Florence Nightingale's Birth)

Ensuring a voice of and for nurses and nursing that is inclusive of the political and the public.

In 2020 move into ICN

ICN funding annually to a total of 450K

Strengthening a professional voice in line with policy, politics and economics



Launched in every continent Over 80 countries Plan for Ireland launch 25<sup>th</sup> April
