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Background

- Transition of an older person into residential care is often unplanned, complex - a journey family members had not prepared for.
- Transition to a nursing home can be difficult for the older adult and their family.
- Little is known about:-

How relatives make sense of this experience What information is needed to help support them with this transition of care.





Aim

The aim of this study is to uncover the challenges experienced by families transitioning their older relatives into residential care.

Methodology

Open narrative questioning was utilised to explore the life stories of six families who transitioned their relatives into residential care.

 Family Dynamics
 Relating to others conflict and congruence
 The relative as the carer
 Pleasing the relative in care

 Failure to prepare
